

## **Before Reading**

#### Discuss the following:

- 1. What do you know about Ann Cole Lowe by looking at the title and cover illustration? What is she wearing around her neck? Why is she dressed like that? Etc.
- 2. What type of book is *Fancy Party Gowns: A Story About Fashion Designer Ann Cole Lowe* by Deborah Blumenthal? Explain (literary non-fiction/biography)
- 3. Why should we be interested is reading biographies?
- 4. How do we know what happened in the past?
- 5. How does the legacy of an individual influence later generations?
- 6. Share a story about someone you have personally read about. How did that person change the way you think, or behave?
- 7. Take a poll. How many students in the group/class have heard of Ann Cole Lowe?
- 8. Define and give examples of figurative language. (ex. Simile, metaphor, and hyperbole)

## **During Reading**

- 1. Read to find out about The Story of Ann Cole Lowe and how she impacted society.
- 2. As you come across challenging words use strategies to gain meaning. Look at the words in context and write what you think they mean. Check the inferred meaning later.
- 3. Discuss the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in the story distinguishing literal from nonliteral language.

For example:

- "...as bright as roses in the garden"
- "...just to get by"
- "...set your spirit soaring"
- "...no two alike"
- "...the pipe had burst"

**Think about the Story Elements:** Setting, plot and character development

- Where does the story take place?
- Who are the characters?
- What happens in the beginning, middle, and end?
- 4. What conflicts arise? Man vs man? Man vs society? Man vs fate? Man vs self? Man vs nature?
- 5. How does the author use illustrations to enhance meaning and tone of the story?
- 6. What kind of person is Ann Cole Lowe?
- 7. What are the central ideas and themes?
- 8. How does Deborah Blumenthal use repeated lines to enhance the development of the themes?
- 9. How does the author choose to arrange the sentences? Discuss the style of writing.
- 10. What is the sequence of events? Describe the connection between events.



## **After Reading**

Look up new vocabulary words and any other difficult words.

Check the inferred meanings.

Re-read or listen to the story uninterrupted.

#### Discuss or write about the following:

- 1. Go back to the poll on how many students knew about Lowe before reading Fancy Party Gowns: The Story of Fashion Designer Ann Cole Lowe.

  Use examples from the story to explain why she is considered a "little-known" designer?
- 2. If she had designed gowns today, what kind of recognition would she receive?
- 3. What can we learn from the past based on the story of Ann Cole Lowe?
- 4. What did you learn from Ann Cole Lowe as a person? Use examples from the book.
- 5. How has the world changed?
- 6. What do you think causes change?
- 7. What influence did Ann Cole Lowe have on society?
- 8. How did Ann's family influence her career path and her drive for success? What events lead up to her success?
- 9. How are the themes of determination, "life isn't fair", and overcoming obstacles developed in the story.

  Find examples of Ann's thoughts, feelings and actions in the book
- 10. Ann said that she made fine clothes "to prove that a Negro can become a major dress designer."
  - Why do you think Ann made fine clothing?



## **Follow Up Activities**

#### 1. Problem and Solution Chart

Using examples from the story, create a chart showing how Ann faced each problem and found a solution.

ex. **Problem:** The water pipe had burst. 10 out of 16 dresses were destroyed.

**Solution:** Ann bought more supplies, hired others to help,

and re-made the dresses.

- 2. Create a time line of Ann Cole Lowe's Life
- 3. Plan, research, and present a report on the life of Ann Cole Lowe using online resources and visual aids
- 4. Design a "Lifetime Achievement Award" for Ann Cole Lowe
- 5. How is Ann Cole Lowe like her dresses? (one of a kind, classy, creative, beautiful)
