
PING-PONG SHABBAT THE TRUE STORY OF CHAMPION ESTEE ACKERMAN

When eleven-year old Ping-Pong phenom Estee Ackerman had her championship match scheduled on the Sabbath, she faced a difficult choice: compete for a gold medal, or honor her faith.

Tournament after tournament, Estee kept winning. She beat all sorts of players. Some were older than Estee. Some were younger. She even beat tennis star Rafael Nadal! She became one of the best Ping-Pong players in the United States.

Estee Ackerman loved Ping-Pong more than anything. But she also loved and honored the Jewish tradition of the Sabbath. At eleven, she began to rise in the ranks of tournament players, making it all the way to the finals of the US National Table Tennis Championships. She only had one player left to beat to win a gold medal-but the final match was set during Shabbat, and the judges said they couldn't change it. How could Estee choose between her passion and her faith? This is the true story of a girl's struggle between her love for her religion and her love of the game.

Discussion Questions

- Have you ever played Ping Pong? If yes, do you enjoy it? If not, would you like to try?
- The book says that Estee feels strong when she plays Ping Pong. Why do you think playing Ping Pong makes her feel that way? What activities do you like to do that make you feel strong?
- When Estee has to choose between Shabbat and Ping Pong, she asks her parents what she should do. They tell her, "It's up to you, Estee".
 Why do you think her parents left the choice up to Estee?
- Turn to the last page of the book and read "In Estee's Own words". What do her words mean to you?
- Look closely at this illustration of Estee and her family. What objects do you see that are connected to celebrating Shabbat? What holidays do your family celebrate? What objects do they use as part of the celebration?



Extension Activity
